Ex-husband, Hans, brings the baby home to his new girlfriend, Marie and an uncertain reception. Marie, herself in need of constant coddling, breaks up with Hans, banishes him and the baby to the garage. Later, when the two kiss and make up, she passes the child onto Lars, her ex boyfriend, a convicted killer. Lars, unable to post

the baby back to Marie, sells it to two lesbians in a bar. One of these women happens to be the deputy prime minister's grown up daughter, Esmeralda. Esmeralda's lover, Vivi, feeling jealous, gives the baby away. What happens next is uncertain, but we do know that the child is last seen in a toilet at Stockholm's International Airport where it is mistakenly repatriated, together with an African refugee family, to Eritrea.
